Dear Residents,

It is with great regret that the Bridgeville Police Department has to announce the passing of K-9 Officer Addo. K-9 Addo had been a member of this department since September 11, 2006.

Addo was diagnosed with a form of bone cancer in October 2010, at which time he was given a life expectancy of 2-4 months. The cancer, although treated, was rapidly evolving and as a result Addo was taken out of service in early December. Addo still accompanied his handler (Officer James Lancia) to work and Addo was to be retired at the end of the year (2010). On December 30, 2010 Addo's service to this community was shortened even more due to complications brought about from an automobile collision which had occurred earlier in the afternoon and he had to be euthanized. Officer Lancia was not injured in the crash.

Prior to the crash and due to a myriad of reasons the decision was made to discontinue the K-9 program (Officer Lancia will remain with the department). I would personally like to thank the businesses and residents that have made donations to the K-9 program over the past 4 years. I would also like to thank all of those involved who have taken part in organizing fund raisers to assist with the costs associated in maintaining the program. Without those contributions the K-9 program would not have been able to continue for as long as it did.

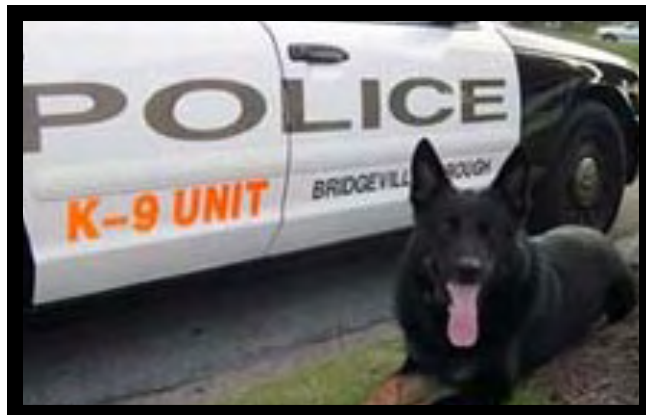
I want to assure the members of our community that in the event a K-9 is needed within our Borough we have the ability to request one from several other Police Departments in Allegheny and Washington Counties.

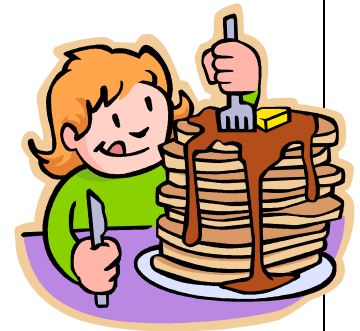

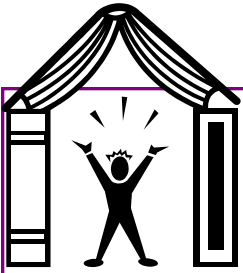

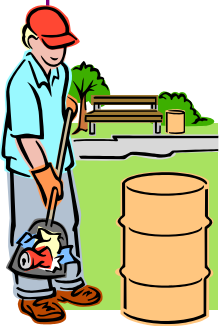
