EIT ALERT!

Beginning in January of 2012, all employers are required by the State of Pennsylvania to begin withholding the local Earned Income Tax (EIT) from their employees' paychecks. State Act 32 of 2008 was passed with the intention of simplifying the way local earned income tax was paid and collected throughout Pennsylvania. Please note that there has been no increase in this tax, it remains 1% (*split equally between Bridgeville Borough and Chartiers Valley School District*). The only change is in the way it is being collected and paid.

In the past many employers would not withhold the local tax, causing the employees to file estimated tax returns and submit tax payments quarterly. Under this new law the Earned Income Taxes for Bridgeville Borough and Chartiers Valley School District will be withheld by your employer and submitted to Jordan Tax Service, the appointed Tax Officer for the Allegheny County Central and Allegheny County Southwest Tax Collection Districts. Jordan Tax Service will then distribute these payments to the local municipality and school district on a timely basis.

It is important that you submit a completed Residency Certification Form to your employer's payroll department as soon as possible. This form is available at the Borough Office as well as on the Bridgeville Borough website www.bridgevilleboro.com and Jordan Tax website www.jordantax.com/Act 32. The form has been pre-filled with the 6 digit Political Subdivision Code (PSD) 730501 assigned to Bridgeville Borough and Chartiers Valley School District. Every wage earner must submit a form to their employer. Please be sure to make copies for each wage earner living in your household.

It is important that you complete this form and submit it to your employer so that your taxes will be sent to where you reside and file your local taxes. If you are self-employed, this form, is not required and you are still required to file and pay quarterly.

If your employer's payroll department is unfamiliar with the form, you may have them contact Jordan Tax Service, Inc. at 412-345-7966.

Please be assured that my office stands ready to assist you should you have any questions or concerns regarding this new way of collecting our local earned income tax. Please don't hesitate to give me a call during business hours at 412-221-6012.

Dear Residents,

With the approach of winter weather I would like to remind residents, property and business owners of their responsibility to remove snow and ice from their sidewalks and roofs within 12 hours of a snowfall. Removal from roofs is necessary when there is a chance that snow or ice could fall from the roof or any part of the structure onto any sidewalk, roadway, or other public way (the same 12 hour rule applies). Most importantly do not deposit the snow on a roadway or next to a fire hydrant. For a full reading of this ordinance please review Chapter 21: Streets and Sidewalks, part (3) Snow and Ice Removal, which can be found on the Bridgeville Borough's website under the "E"-Code.

Our department along with several surrounding jurisdictions have endured a rash of night time vehicle break-ins. I would like to remind residents to keep their vehicles locked and remove all valuables from said vehicles (out of sight, out of mind). Locking your vehicle should be a priority. Most vehicles have garage door openers inside. If a thief enters your car, he now has access to your house.

I would like to introduce the Police Department's two newest members/part-time officers: Patrolman Alex Lee and Patrolman Josh Dobbin. Both officers are also deputy Sheriffs in Washington County. Ptl. Lee has been a member of this department since April of 2011 and Ptl. Dobbin was hired in November of 2011.

Daylight Savings Time Ends:

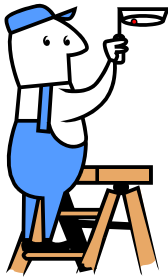
Set your clocks back one hour on November 6, 2011.

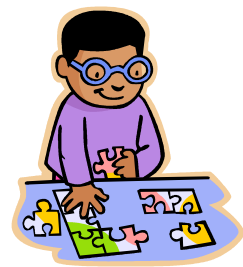

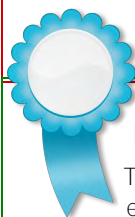
