It's that time of the year as Zoning Compliance Officer to remind residents of the ordinances in place within the Borough. I am here to assist residents with any and all questions regarding the requirements or to offer my assistance with permitting applications.

Street Sweeper Days – Vehicles must be moved on street sweeper days. The schedule has been provided on page 3 for review. Everyone wants their street swept. Our Public Works Department strives to do a great job in all neighborhoods. Please help us by moving vehicles for the short period of time the sweeper is on your street. Nowhere to move your car? Call my office and we will assist you in finding a place to move your car while we are sweeping.

Property Maintenance – Properties must be maintained within the Borough free of litter and debris. Remember, its grass cutting season – please cut and maintain your lawns. Property owners with grass higher than 6" may receive a compliance notification. Please maintain your residence for the health and safety of all.

Leash Law – Dogs are not permitted to run at large. Please keep your pets on a leash and keep them safe.

Dog License – Dogs within Allegheny County are required to have a current license. Applications are available at the Borough Building or may be downloaded from our website.

Dog Clean-Up – Please be proactive about cleaning up after your pet when out walking or just in your yard. Borough Ordinance requires a clean-up of dog waste every 24 hours.

Fences and Sheds – Zoning Compliance Permits are required for the erection of all fences and sheds. Check with the administrative office regarding what is needed to apply. It only takes a few minutes to secure a permit.

Retaining Walls - Zoning Compliance Permits are required for the construction of a retaining wall less than 4' in height. Walls 4' or higher require a building permit. Contact my office for more information.

Hedges and Bushes may not block the sight-distance from any corner property or intersection (including alleys). Please trim your bushes to meet the 4' requirement. Let's keep our roadways safe by not limiting the sight distance of vehicular traffic to pedestrians or other vehicles.

Garbage/Trash Pick-Up – All trash and recycling is picked up on Mondays in the Borough. Please be aware that the Borough Ordinance does not permit trash placed at the curb prior to 6pm on Sundays. Please make arrangements to have your trash placed out by a neighbor if you are going to be away. In this hot summer weather, the trash becomes a nuisance if it is left at the curb for an extended period of time.

Questions regarding items that the hauler will take – call our office and we will be glad to assist you. Special pick-ups with the hauler may also be arranged should you have a special need.

Please note the Trash and Recycling will not be picked up on Memorial Day. The service will be delayed until Tuesday June 1st. Remember our town hosts the Memorial Day Parade and a clean downtown makes the event much more enjoyable.

Chief Chad King, Bridgeville Police Department



The Bridgeville Police Department is pleased to report that two Police Officers will soon be added to the force. The Officers, who were approved at the April council meeting, will be hired on a part-time basis, not to exceed 32 hours each per week. This will be a tremendous help manpower-wise as it will make the departments schedule more streamlined. It will enable the Department to keep at least two Officers on duty for every shift more often than not. It will also allow for three Officers to be scheduled for the anticipated busier days/shifts (Fridays & Saturdays) more often.

I would also like to announce that the Police Department has ordered five more AR-15 semi-automatic Patrol Rifles. This will allow for each Officer to be issued their own rifle to train with and deploy as a duty weapon if needed. Each Officer having their own Rifle allows them to have the rifle sighted in to their own specifications. With the number of serious crimes and critical incidents on the rise, the importance of each Officer having their own weapon to train with is paramount. All Officers are required to pass a Departmental designed and State approved qualification course each year with their firearms (pistol, shotgun, patrol rifle).

As always, gun locks can be obtained by residents at the Police Department at no charge.

In an added effort to promote child

safety the Bridgeville Police Department has purchased child safety ID kits. The ID kits are available (no charge) at the Bridgeville Police Department between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. The kits will also be distributed at the Community Day festivities on June 19th 2010. The kits consist of a fingerprint kit, DNA collection/storage kit, dental chart, and photo page for the parent/guardian to keep in their possession. Directions are included and the kits can be completed by the child's parents.

New Library Building -

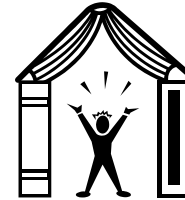
Groundbreaking ceremonies were held February 21, 2010 and the much anticipated new building is finally under construction.

If all goes well, a grand opening celebration will be held in December, 2010.

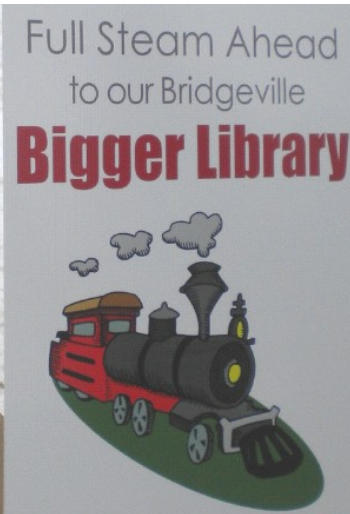

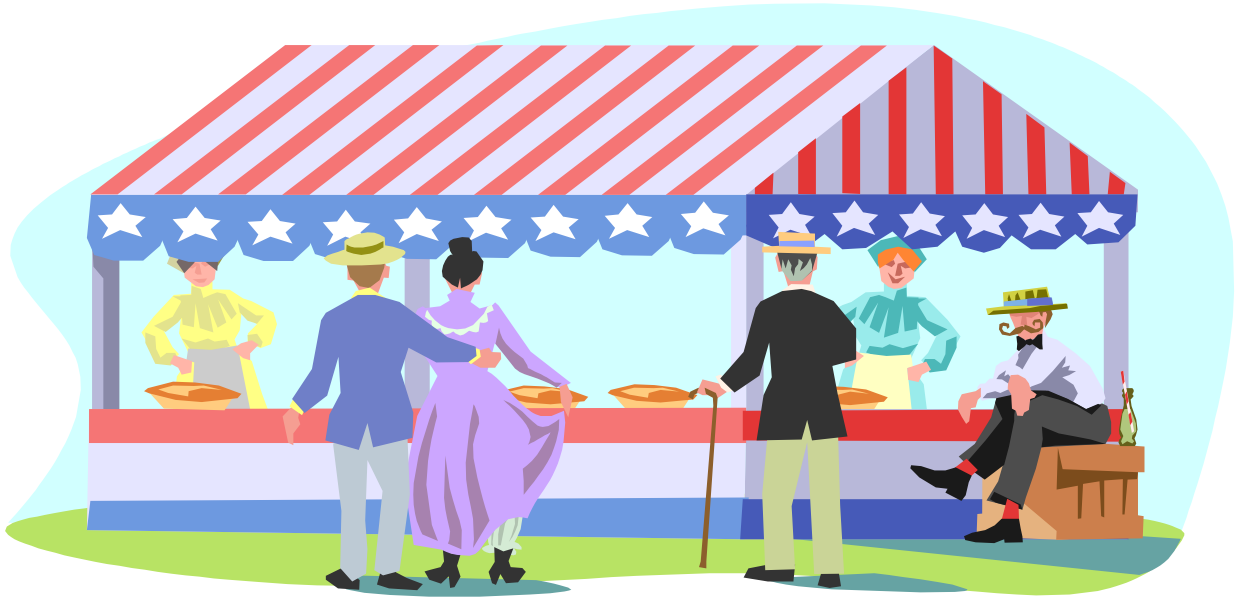

With community support, the Bridgeville Council, Town Center Associates, and the community volunteers of Bridgeville, we are proud to present to you our first **"Bridgeville's Tuesday Farmers Market"**.

This is a nonprofit event sponsored by community volunteers.

Simmons Farm Market will be one of the main vendors for the **"Bridgeville's Tuesday Farmers Market"**.

We have a list of farmers, food vendors, health and wellness organizations, and many more who have committed to our Farmers Market.

A Message from the Real Estate Tax Office:

Taxpayers will once again be able to pay the Chartiers Valley School Tax in quarterly installments. The payment due dates are: October 15; December 15; February 15; and April 15. If you do not pay by the discount date of August 31, or by the face date of October 31, it is recommended that you take advantage of this installment plan. If the taxes are not paid by the end of December, the unpaid are turned over to the lien Tax Collector and an ADDITIONAL 10% penalty will be added to your tax bill. This applies to SCHOOL TAXES ONLY. The Borough tax remains the same as indicated on the tax statement.



Also it really helps if you include a stamped, self-addressed envelope when paying your taxes to insure getting your receipts in a timely manner.
