2017 PAVEMENT MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

Bids were advertised and publicly opened on Friday April 7, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers for the 2017 Pavement Maintenance Program with the following bid results:

Tolmer stated that \$74,966.25 will be reimbursed through a project share agreement with the Pennsylvania American Water Company. All in favor, motion carried 7-0.

ORDINANCE NO. 995

Cherry tabling Ordinance No. 995; an ordinance amending Chapter 16 Parks and Recreation, Part 2, Park Rules & Regulation, §203, Prohibited Conduct, to prohibit smoking of tobacco and use of electronic nicotine device (E-Cigarettes) in Borough Public Parks. All in favor, motion carried 7-0.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 996

A motion was made by B. Ghelarducci, seconded by B. Cherry approving Manager Collins to advertise Proposed Ordinance No. 996; an ordinance authorizing the execution of an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with other local municipalities establishing the "Robinson Run-Chartiers Creek Municipal Watershed Alliance" and providing for the governance thereof. Remarks: M. Tolmer stated that Mt. Pleasant Township, McDonald Borough, North Fayette Township, Oakdale Borough, Bridgeville Borough, Robinson Township, South Fayette Township and Collier Township are the initial municipalities that will make up the Alliance. All in favor, motion carried 7-0.

2017 CCTV and Point Repair Contracts

The contracts for the Point Repairs as part of Contract A have been executed by Soli Construction. They will be starting by the end of April. We have held the pre-construction meeting for the CCTV contract with AAA Pipe Cleaning and they will be starting on Monday April 17, 2017. They will be providing notification to the residents when they are in their neighborhoods.

ALCOSAN Grow Green Grant

We attended an informational session with the Manager at Alcosan regarding the Alcosan Grow Green Grant program to obtain information related to the submission and project qualification requirements. We have reviewed potential projects within the borough and have identified possible two projects to be considered for the grant. The two locations are the drainage swales that have sanitary sewers below New York Street and above McLaughlin Run Road behind ABD Sprinkler. The purpose of the grant is to fund projects to remove storm water from the sanitary sewer line. In order to have a viable project, Alcosan is requesting the documentation of inflows to be submitted which need to be collected. So that we can make a solid submission for the next round, we will be completing flow monitoring to identify changes in flow during storm events. Once we have sufficient justification, a conceptual design and cost estimate will be prepared for the submission.

2015 Pavement Maintenance Program – Contract B – Bower Hill Road Repairs

Peoples Gas has completed the replacement of the main gas line on Bower Hill Road and performed trench paving restoration. We have been in contact with T.A. Robinson Asphalt and will be meeting in the next week to establish the schedule for the work.

McLaughlin Run Park – Phase 2

The design and bidding documents for the Phase 2 improvements to McLaughlin Run Park have been submitted to the DCNR for review and approval prior to the project being placed out for bid. Upon receipt of their comments and addressing them we will put it out for bid.

Chartiers Street, Washington Avenue and Chartiers Creek Bridge Intersection

PennDOT informed us at the project status meeting on January 26, 2017 that the design engineer had been selected in December 2016 and that they would be having a kick off meeting with them by the end of February to start the design. We attended a PennDOT comprehensive project meeting on April 6, 2017 with the Manager and this project was mentioned as being in design. PennDOT is working on assembling all of the funding for construction.

FIRE CHIEF, WILLIAM CHILLO

Chief Chilleo stated that there was a training class on how to rescue firemen in a collapse or fire in a reasonable amount of time. There were 25 students that attended the class.

Manager Collins provided her written report. She stated that she sent a letter to our salt supplier letting them know that we wish to opt in for another year. We have to purchase 80% of our reserved 900 tons. 245 tons must still be purchased.

N. Lyons stated that he is very disappointed to not see a parking authority delegate here. He believes there is an issue at hand that needs addressed.
